In karesansui, the traditional Japanese rock garden, the sea is symbolized by a layer of white sand carefully raked into a pattern of furrows representing the rippling movement of waves. Matsunaga et al. (p. 251) studied a group of 343 Japanese OCD patients to determine whether the symptom structure of OCD is stable transculturally, or whether the obsessional aspects of traditional Japanese culture are reflected in symptom dimensions distinct from those found in Western studies.
