Patients with schizophrenia have been shown to have deficits in emotion recognition, and some studies have suggested greater deficits in non-Caucasian patients. Pinkham et al. (p. 639), remarking that these studies included only Caucasian faces as stimuli, designed a study using Caucasian and African American faces in emotion recognition and face memory tasks. When the tasks were completed by Caucasian and African American schizophrenia patients and healthy comparison groups of both races, the authors found that participants of both races fared better in both tasks when viewing stimuli of subjects of their own race.
